# Year 3 Maths



Over the last two years, we have been working with the Turing Maths Hub to enable us to fully start following a 'Mastery Approach' to teaching Maths.

This year, from Year 1, we will be following a new Scheme of Learning.

The Oak National Academy scheme follows the National Curriculum and breaks it down into smaller steps.

- Maths mastery is a teaching approach focused on developing a deep, long-term, and adaptable understanding of mathematics, rather than just rote memorisation. It emphasizes that all students can learn maths at the same rate by thoroughly mastering one topic before moving to the next.

# Year 3 Spelling/Phonics



The half-termly spelling list will be posted on Class Dojo at the start of the half-term.

In class, we revisit previous spellings, as well as learning, exploring, writing and using the current week's spelling words.

Some children will be continuing to learn phonics using Little Wandle.

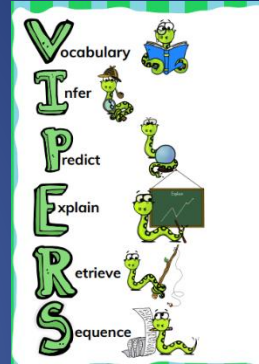
All children have a login for Spelling Shed (in their reading journal) and can practise at home, if they so choose.

# Year 3 Reading



All children in Year 3 have at least two practise reading sessions a week with their teacher/TA. Little Wandle children will read every day.

Children learn VIPERS reading skills – Vocabulary, Inference, Prediction, Evidence, Retrieval and Sequencing/Summarising.



It is ESSENTIAL that children read every day at home – aim for 15-20 minutes. The most important thing is to help them enjoy books – read to them, talk about the books you read, listen to audiobooks.

Children have a reading record – please write the date and pages they have read, every time they read and sign it.

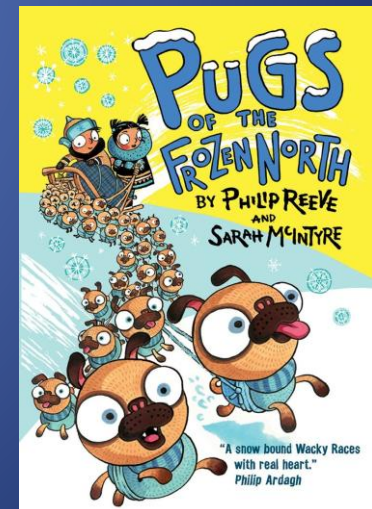
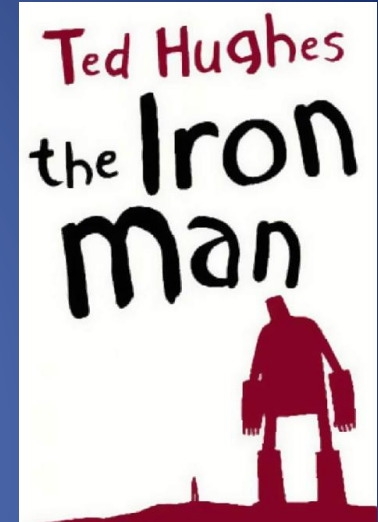
# Year 3 Writing



In Year 3, we will be reading a number of books with the class: Voices In The Park by Anthony Browne, Iron Man by Ted Hughes, and Pugs Of The Frozen North by Philip Reeve.

Our writing will include:

Sci-Fi and fantasy narratives, persuasive adverts, instructions, letters, non-chronological reports and poetry.

# PHSE Scheme



This year we will continue to use a scheme called Jigsaw. It covers 6 main themes:

**Being Me in My World** - 'Who am I and how do I fit?'

**Celebrating Difference** - Respect for similarity and difference. Anti-bullying and being unique

**Dreams and Goals** - Aspirations, how to achieve goals and understanding the emotions that go with this

**Healthy Me** - Being and keeping safe and healthy

**Relationships** - Building positive, healthy relationships

**Changing Me** - Coping positively with change

Each half-term, we will put on Dojo what information will be covered in case you have any questions you want to ask before we teach that topic.

# Homework and Reading Books



## When will reading books be sent home?

Your child will be given 2 reading books from their current book band each week. In addition, they will also be able to choose a library book to take home every 2 weeks. This could be a book that is too difficult for them to read but that they would enjoy reading with an adult.

Your child will have a Reading Journal in which to do their homework. The homework task is largely a 'talk homework' – a powerpoint will be put on Dojo every Friday and a question to discuss will be put in children's Reading Journal. Please talk about the question with your child and get them to write down 2 or 3 ideas about it. They can then use this when we discuss it in class on Thursdays.

Books/reading journals/reading record need to be brought in on Thursdays and will go home on Fridays. Star stamps will be given for effort and presentation. 20 stars = a prize!

# Routines



## **When does school start?**

The school gates are opened at 8.45am for the children to enter school, registration is at 8.55am.

## **What time does school finish?**

The school gates are opened at 3.25pm for a 3.30pm finish.

**When arriving at/leaving school, please do not let children play on the trails/climbing frames. Also, children should not ride bikes/scooters across the playground, for safety reasons.**

## **What should my child bring to school?**

All children will need is one named water bottle (plastic not glass) and their packed lunch/snack. Pencil cases are not necessary - all equipment is provided by school. Please ensure you do not send anything in from home (including toys). Book bags should be brought in on Thursdays.



# What do I do if my child is ill?



If your child is unwell it is very important that they are kept off school until they are fully recovered.

If your child vomits or has diarrhoea they should be kept off for 48 hrs after their last bout of sickness.

Please ring the office to report sickness/absences.

# PE Kits and Daily Mile



On the day that your child's class has PE, they must come into school in their PE kit for the whole day. **Please ensure your child is not wearing earrings on PE days.**

## **What day is PE?**

PE in Year 3 will take place on a Tuesday and Friday. These are also our daily mile days!

## **What is the correct PE kit?**

PE Kit: PE lessons will be taking place outside or in the hall. The children must wear a white round neck t-shirt with either blue shorts or blue track suit bottoms/leggings. They can also bring an unbranded navy tracksuit top/jumper. They can wear trainers or pumps. Please, no football kits or gymnastic leotards and no clothes with brands/logos on.

Long hair should always be tied back (not just on PE days).

# What are the uniform rules?



## Hair

Long hair must be tied up and no large bows/headbands should be worn.

## Jewellery

Stud earrings only – no hooped earrings.

No necklaces/bracelets, other than ones worn for religious reasons. Do not wear ANY jewellery on PE days, please.

## Shoes

Proper black school shoes should be worn on non-PE/Daily Mile days – no trainers/boots.

## PE Kit

PE Kit is a plain white t-shirt, plain navy shorts or jogging bottoms and a plain navy hoodie – children should not wear their school jumper/cardigan for PE.

**PLEASE ENSURE ALL UNIFORM HAS YOUR CHILD'S NAME IN IT!**



# Provision

Throughout the year, your child may attend an provision group. This is to provide extra input in certain curriculum areas, such as literacy and numeracy.

Provision is not only to help some children to meet their age related expectations, but also to stretch children working at greater depth.

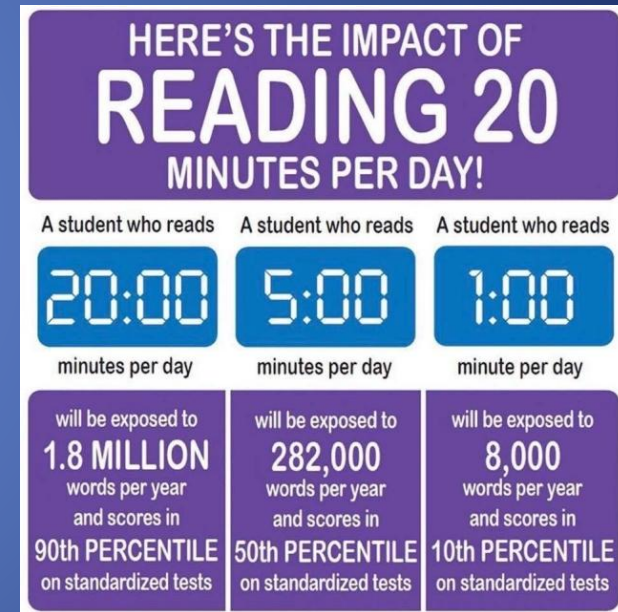
The children may work with any of the TAs across the LKS2 department.

# How can I help my child at home?



Reading **every day** with your child is the best way to help them advance in ALL curriculum areas. Try to involve reading in every day tasks and not just with their reading book – get them to read road signs, recipes, menus etc.

Learning times tables and number bonds is also massively important, especially as there is a national standardized times table test now being done at the end of Year 4. This helps your child access all areas of the Maths curriculum.
